2020 Annual General Meeting Minutes

Date: September 16th, 2020

Location: Zoom

Stuart Amory - Welcomed everyone to the meeting and gave an overview of the agenda.

Ian Adamson (President, World Obstacle) - Gave an overview of the future of OCR and how the sport is developing at a world level.

Oner Avara (President) - Gave a short statement on the work that has been done in 2020.

Shaun Wilde (Development Commission Chair) - Presented the work that has been done to introduce a UKOSF Level 2 coaching course in the UK and how there will be future Level 3 and Level 4 courses available.

Shaun also gave an overview of the future Technical Officials programme that will be made available in 2021.

Emma Waring (Youth Development Commission Chair) - Presented a short update on youth development and plans for 2021.

James Burton (Competition & Safety Committee Lead) - Presented an overview of the work done in 2020 to build relationships with race directors and training centres. James also shared the coronavirus guidance that was produced for events and the initial UK team that was selected for the cancelled 2020 FISO OCR World Championships.

It was presented that a key task in 2021 will be to introduce event and training centre accreditation.

In response to questions James confirmed that there would be no UK Championships or UKOSF League in 2021. James also highlighted that 2021 will be a year focussed on governance vs. events to ensure the federation is ready to apply for recognition.

Becky Rendell (Athlete Lead) - Presented the proposed plans to introduce a National Athlete Council of 8-10 international standard athlete representatives to provide feedback to the federation.

James Burton (Competition & Safety Committee Lead) - Presented an overview of the successful UK OCR Short Course Competition that involved 23 training centres and had 552 unique athlete course attempts. The competition will finish with two regional finals.

The AGM concluded with a Q&A.

During the Q&A it was confirmed that all 2020 members would have their membership extended until the end of 2021 at no cost given the issues with the pandemic.

Note no resolutions were raised for member approval at this meeting.
